Charles Darwin (1809-1882) Born at Shrewsbury, Darwin came from an affluent family, descended from successful country doctors on one side and the Wedgwood family (of pottery fame) on the other. He was intended to follow the family tradition of medicine, but couldn't stand the bloody nature of surgery, and seemed likely to become a wastrel.
