Haydn was often called "Papa Joe" or "Papa Haydn" by his students and fellow musicians, because he was so kind and like a father to them. In 1759, when Haydn was 27, he became the music director of 16 musicians for Count Karl Joseph Franz Morzin's orchestra in Vienna. It was the first time in his life that he earned a decent salary.

But on 24 April 1801, after a delay caused by a death in the Schwarzenberg family, The Seasons eventually received its first performance under Haydn's direction, once again a semi-private performance given by the same soloists who had sung at the first public performance of The Creation (the Saals and Rathmeyer), an orchestra largely made up of members of the opera orchestra, and a chorus drawn from the choirs of the city's churches.
